tracting the work together, the group saved 35% compared to what similar municipalities paid for inventories in recent years.

Yard Waste

All Yard Waste should be placed in a designated yard waste can or brown yard bags for pickup. Yard Waste in plastic bags will NOT be picked up.

Reminder

As we strive to keep our city Clean & Beautiful please do not place trash/

yard waste/recycle receptacles on the curb before dusk of the evening before pick-up. Once the trash/yard waste/ recycle receptacles have been emptied they should be removed from the curb the same day it was picked up. Failure to comply with the above could result in the resident receiving a summons to appear in court.

Payments to City Hall

The forms of payments to the City of Vinita Park must be cash, money orders, or a business check. No personal checks will be accepted for payment. We apologize for any inconvenience.

Code Adoption

Ordinance No. 1247, Adoption of the National Electrical Code/2008, NFPA 70 and Ordinance No.1248, Adoption of the International Code Council (ICC) Codes were passed at the March 16, 2015 Board Meeting. The following code books will be on file at the City Hall for public to view 2009 ICC Code Book and 2008 National Electrical Code Book (NEC).

BASIC EMERGENCY SUPPLY KIT

A basic emergency supply kit could include the following recommended items:

- Water, one gallon of water per person per day for at least three days, for drinking and sanitation
- Food, at least a three-day supply of nonperishable food
- Battery-powered or hand crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert and extra batteries for both
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- First aid kit
- Whistle to signal for help
- Dust mask to help filter contaminated air and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-inplace
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- · Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- · Manual can opener for food
- Local maps
- Cell phone with chargers, inverter or solar charger

Once you have gathered the supplies for a basic emergency kit, you may want to consider adding the following items:

- Prescription medications and glasses
- Infant formula and diapers
- Pet food and extra water for your pet
- · Cash or traveler's checks and change
- Important family documents such as copies of insurance policies, identification and bank account records in a water proof, portable container. You can use the Emergency Financial First Aid Kit -EFFAK (PDF - 977Kb) developed by Operation Hope, FEMA and Citizen Corps to help you organize your information.
- Emergency reference material such as a first aid book or free information from this web site. (See Publications)
- Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each person. Consider additional bedding if you live in a coldweather climate.
- Complete change of clothing including a long sleeved shirt, long pants and sturdy shoes. Consider additional clothing if you live in a coldweather climate.
- Household chlorine bleach and medicine dropper
- When diluted, nine parts water to one part bleach, bleach can be used as a disinfectant. Alternatively, in an emergency, you can use it to treat water by using 16 drops of regular household liquid bleach per gallon of water. Do not use scented, color safe or bleaches with added cleaners.
- Fire extinguisher
- Matches in a waterproof container
- Feminine supplies and personal hygiene items
- Mess kits, paper cups, plates, paper towels and plastic utensils

- Paper and pencil
- Books, games, puzzles or other activities for children

NEWS WORTH KNOWING

WORDS FROM THE MAYOR

The City of Vinita Park and Village of Vinita Terrace are jointly proposing a consolidation between our communities, which are immediately adjacent and contiguous to each other. Our two communities and our residents would greatly benefit from the boundary commission agreeing to this voluntary consolidation. The proposal has the unanimous support of our respective boards and citizens. In the 2010 United State Census, Vinita Park had a population of 1,880 residents and Vinita Terrance a population of 277. Following our proposed consolidation, the community would continue to be known as Vinita Park.

With the passage of Senate Bill 5, it was apparent that the Missouri General Assembly wanted smaller communities in St. Louis County to consolidate to better provide essential services. Several Mayors and Alderpersons from multiple municipalities, plus Pat Kelly, of St. Louis County Municipal League traveled to Jefferson City, Cole County Court for the hearing. Mr. Pittinsky presented summary arguments against Senate Bill 5 as follows:

- 1. Senate Bill 5 is a 'special rule' as it 'narrow' targets only St. Louis County. Only St. Louis County Municipalities are subject to the 12.5% cap, the rest of state can keep 20%. Only St. Louis County Municipalities have the burden of the annual audit, CALEA or State certification, and more.
- 2. Hancock violation-no funding was allocated by the State to pay for any of the new burdens placed on St. Louis Municipalities.
- 3. Separation of Powers violation-will instruct Department Of Revenue (Executive Branch) to instruct the Circuit Court to revoke the muni's municipal court authority. Only the Supreme Court should make such a determination, not the auditor or Department of Revenue employee.
- 4. The State Constitution Article 5, Section 2716 gives to munis with less than 400,000 population the absolute right to enforce their

own laws. Senate Bill 5 usurps that right. The judge asked each side to submit within 15 days the declaratory judgment each wants him to sign and he will do his best to rule quickly. I hope this means we will have some kind of resolution to this problem very soon.

We also are working on consolidation of our courts that could save the City of Vinita Park about \$50,000 to \$60,000 a year. We have scheduled a town hall meeting to discuss the merger with Vinita Terrace and the consolidation of our courts and to answer any questions you may have for Monday March 21st, 2016 at 6:00pm at City Hall.

The City of Vinita Park is in partnership with United 4 Children, the 24:1 Early Childhood Learning Center at 6633 Dr. Martin Luther King Drive St. Louis, MO 63133. The center will have a ribbon cutting on March 22, 2016 at 5:30pm signifying this important moment for the 24:1 communities. This center provides the children with necessary skills in order to meet the Missouri Early Learning Standards. Please contact Gail Wulff at 314-383-3252 for more information.

I would like to thank all of the adult residents for attending the 24:1 Cinema Saturday February 13th, 2016 to see "Do the Right Thing". I hope everyone understood the message within. I would also like to thank our North County Police Cooperative for taking 70 to 80 of our North County Cooperative children to 24:1 Cinema to see Kung Fu Panda 3 Saturday on February 20th, 2016.

The police department is very proud to say we once again lowered the number of burglaries in Vinita Park. Our number for 2014 was already at a very low 22. We were able to

cut that number by more than half in 2015, a total of 9. This is due to increased patrols, better investigations and the assistance of the public. Thank you for helping us provide quality service to the communitv. We have all heard about Senate Bill 5 and the changes it may bring in our police techniques. Rest assured, we will continue to vigorously enforce traffic laws to make sure the public is safe on the streets of Vinita Park. Permits

Occupancy Inspection and Permit Required It shall be unlawful for any person or family to occupy or for any owner or agent to permit the occupant of any building or dwelling of a unit, until the inspection is complete and an occupancy permit has been issued. The occupancy permit shall not be issued until all violations on the property have been brought into compliance.

24:1 MUNICIPAL TREE GRANTS PROMOTE COLLABORATION, SAVE MONEY PRESS RELEASE

This year the City of Vinita Park was on of 12, 24:1 Area Municipalities to receive an

award of up to \$10,000 from the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) through its Tree Resource Improvement and Maintenance (TRIM) cost-share grant program. Beyond Housing wrote grants in coordination with 10 of the 12 municipalities. 24:1 refers to the 24 communities within the boundaries of the Normandy Schools collaborative geography for one vision of strong communities, engaged families and successful children. 24:1 is a place-based community initiative convened and facilitated by Beyond Housing. As part of this initiative, a majority of the 24:1 area municipalities are working together to provide more effective and efficient service delivery.

As a result, this year up to \$70,000 is available to be invested in the following 10 municipalities – Bellerive Acres, Cool Valley, Glen Echo Park, Hanley Hills, Pagedale, Pine Lawn, Upland Park, Velda Village Hills, Vinita Park, and Vinita Terrace. MDC funds are matched with recipient funds to improve trees in the community, resulting in a total investment of close to \$100,000. This grant will be used to

strategically remove roughly 160 hazardous and critically dangerous trees on municipal property.

TRIM is a competitive grant that helps communities provide safe and healthy trees. Investment in trees provides lasting improvements in cleaning the air, soil and water. The participating municipalities jointly bid the work to make the state and local tax dollars go farther. This year, Beyond Housing estimates the municipalities saved close to \$60,000 by bidding the work together.

This is the second year that these 10 municipalities have received such a grant. Last year, Beyond Housing received a Collaborative Tree TRIM grant of \$25,000 that paid for professional tree inventories for all 10 of these municipalities. This was the largest grant ever given by the state for this kind of work and never before had so many municipalities collaborated together on one grant. By con-
