Code Adoption

Ordinance No. 1247 Adoption of the National Electrical Code/2008. BASIC EMERGENCY SUPPLY KIT

A basic emergency supply kit could include the following recommended items:

- Water, one gallon of water per person per day for at least three days, for drinking and sanitation
- Food, at least a three-day supply of non-perishable food
- Battery-powered or hand crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert and extra batteries for both
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- First aid kit
- Whistle to signal for help
- Dust mask to help filter contaminated air and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- Manual can opener for food
- Local maps
- · Cell phone with chargers, inverter or solar charger

Once you have gathered the supplies for a basic emergency kit, you may want to consider adding the following items:

- Prescription medications and glasses
- Infant formula and diapers
- · Pet food and extra water for your
- · Cash or traveler's checks and change
- Important family documents such as copies of insurance policies. identification and bank account records in a waterproof, portable container. You can use the **Emergency Financial First Aid** Kit - EFFAK (PDF - 977Kb) developed by Operation Hope, FEMA and Citizen Corps to help you organize your information.
- Emergency reference material such as a first aid book or free in formation from this web site. (See Publications)
- Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each person. Consider additional bedding if you live in a coldweather climate.
- Complete change of clothing including a long sleeved shirt, long pants and sturdy shoes. Consider additional clothing if you live in a cold-weather climate.
- Household chlorine bleach and medicine dropper – When diluted, nine parts water to one part bleach, bleach can be used as a disinfectant. Or in an emergency, you can use it to treat water by using 16 drops of regular household liquid bleach per gallon of water. Do not use scented, color safe or bleaches with added cleaners.
- Fire extinguisher
- · Matches in a waterproof container
- Feminine supplies and personal hygiene items
- · Mess kits, paper cups, plates, paper towels and plastic utensils
- Paper and pencil
- Books, games, puzzles or other activities for children

WORDS FROM THE MAYOR

To all Vinita Park residents, the City of who keeps our city is clean and beauti-Vinita Park is a vital prospering community. Our demographics include 70% black, 29% white, and 1% Hispanic/ other.

Over half of Vinita Park's land mass is zoned industrial. Vi-Jon. Federal Express, United Industries, Schnuck's Oberweiss Dairy, U.S. Foods, Best Transportation, Americold, Boldine Industries, and FedEx Home Delivery are just a few of the larger corporations located within the city limits. Because of these entrenched and flourishing businesses, Vinita Park's fiscal viability is stronger than ever. Their revenues have increased consistently over the years. The fiscal budget for 2015 and 2016 is expected to be in excess of \$3,000,000.00, which has been the budget balance for the last five years. Our operating reserve at \$217,409.00, CD savings is \$202,000.00, and capital reserve is \$1,074, 059.00. Our overall reserved \$1, 291,468,00, and there is no tax increase. You have to vote on tax increase. Taxes been the same since I been in office as Mayor.

Because of its thriving business community, the City of Vinita Park is not hindered by dependence on revenues from alternative sources. The specter of ticket revenues and the County "tax pool" have very little if any impact on the overall budget. The City of Vinita Park is fiscally sound and will continue to be a dynamic force in North County for decades to come.

The City of Vinita Park's workforce continues to increase. The Police Department with 22 employees, is the largest department in the City of Vinita Park. Their goal is to make sure our residents feel safe in their homes. The Public Works department has 5 employees ful. In totall the city has approximately 35 employees.

The city is governed by its Mayor James McGee and six Board of Aldermen. Ward 1 Alderman Rich Redel, Alderman

Brian Gremaud. Ward 2: Alderwoman Ora Mae Stokes,

Alderwoman Wanda Fairley. Ward 3: Alderwoman Celestine McGee, Alderwoman Veronica Conner

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen work closely together to provide the City of Vinita Park with the very best customer service. The employees work hand in hand as a family with the elected officials to provide professional, courteous, and thoughtful service. Rate Increase Notice Effective February 1, 2015 Residential/Commercial Inspection & Occupancy Permits

- One Hundred Dollars (\$100) for the initial residential inspection
- One Hundred Twenty Five Dollars (\$125) for the initial commercial Inspection
- No Charge for the first residential or commercial re-inspection
- Seventy-Five Dollars (\$75) for the 2nd re-inspection of the same residential or commercial property, including fire marshal's re-inspection
- Fifty Dollars (\$50) for fire inspection for each new commercial occupancy inspection
- Fifty Dollars (\$50) for the occupancy permit sale property
- Forty Dollars (\$40) for the occupancy permit for residential rental property
- Fifty Dollars (\$50) for commercial occupancy permit
- Fifteen Dollars (\$15) for a copy of any type of occupancy permit
- Fifty Dollars (\$50) for an amended copy of any type of occupancy permit

Park Reservations

 Thirty Dollars (\$30) reservation fee for residents of Vinita Park plus one hundred dollars (\$100) refundable deposit Seventy-Five Dollars (\$75)
reservation fee for non-residents
of Vinita Park plus one hundred
dollars (\$100) refundable deposit

Pet Tags

• Ten Dollars (\$10)

Occupancy Inspection and Permit Required

It shall be unlawful for any person or family to occupy or for any owner or agent to permit the occupant of any building or dwelling of a unit, until the inspection is complete and an occupancy permit has been issued. The occupancy permit shall not be issued until all violations on the property have been brought into compliance.

Street Sweeper

The street sweeper will operate from April 1st through December 1st.

Trash Containers

Please remember to remove your trash/recycle/yard waste containers from the curb the same day service is rendered to avoid receiving a citation.

Leaves/Yard Waste

Yard waste pickup will be every Friday. Please use the yard waste container or brown yard waste bags. Please do not rake leaves into the streets.

Please do **NOT** leave grass clipping in the street; this is considered littering and a summons will be issued.
